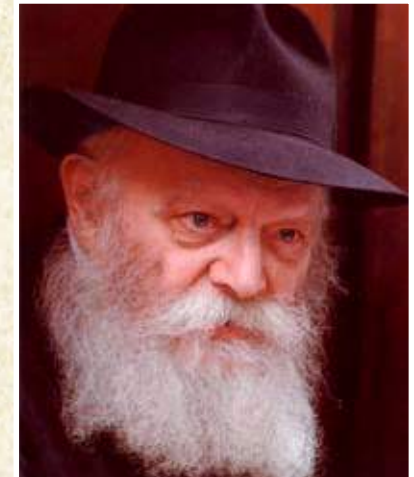

## ROSH HASHANA

- The primary **Mitzvah** is for every Jew to hear the **Shofar** each day a minimum of 30 blasts. The prevailing custom is to blow 100 or more. The sound of the **Shofar** resembles the cry of a child yearning to return to his/her father.
- **Rosh Hashanah** until after **Yom Kippur** are known as the 10 days of Repentance.
- The **Shabbat** before **Yom Kippur** is known as **Shabbat Shuvah** – The **Shabbat** of Repentance.

## YOM KIPPUR

- **The Day of Atonement**, atones only for sins between man and G-d. For sins between one person and another, one must personally ask the other for forgiveness before G-d can forgive.
- It is a **Mitzvah** to eat festive meals the day before **Yom Kippur** and upon breaking the fast.
- On **Yom Kippur** one is forbidden to eat and drink, wear leather shoes, bathe or anoint oneself with any sort of cosmetic or lotion, and to engage in intimacy.
- Many have the custom to wear white on **Yom Kippur** symbolizing purity from sin, or to represent our similarity to angels.

## SUKKOT/SIMCHAT TORAH

- The two **Mitzvot** of the Holiday of **Sukkot** are "To dwell in the **Sukkah**", and "To shake the four Species". The four Species are the **Lulav** (date palm), **Etrog** (citron), **Haddas** (myrtle) and **Aravah** (willow). We shake the four species all seven days of **Sukkot** except for **Shabbat**.
- The four Species represent all types of Jews, only when we have everyone together are the Jewish people complete.
- One is meant to eat all their meals in the **Sukkah** (a temporary structure covered by loose tree branches).
- **Sukkot** is known as "**Zman Simchateinu**" – The time of our rejoicing, more than any other Holiday.
- **Simchat Torah** is the tremendous celebration of concluding the yearly cycle of Torah reading. We express this joy by singing and dancing with the Torah, known as "**Hakafot**".

## Customs

- On the first night of **Rosh Hashanah** we dip an apple in honey, signifying our wishes for a sweet new year.
- Many have a custom to eat foods that symbolize plentifulness and being ahead. The Sephardic custom is to recite special prayers with each food.
- On the first afternoon of **Rosh Hashanah** we visit a body of water containing fish to symbolically cast away our sins. This is known as **Tashlich**.
- On the second night of **Rosh Hashanah** it is customary to have a new fruit on which we recite the "**Shehecheyanu**" blessing.

## Did you know?

- Tishrei is the most holiday-filled month in the Jewish calendar — almost half the month is made up of festivals or special days!
- Like other Hebrew months, "Tishrei" is a Babylonian name and means "beginning". It reflects the Jewish people's time in Babylonian exile.
- According to tradition, the world was created on the 25th of Elul, making Rosh Hashanah (1 Tishrei) the sixth day of creation — the day Adam and Eve were created.
- The Zodiac of Tishrei is Libra (scales) — a perfect match for a month focused on judgment and balance.

# THE BA'AL SHEM TOV

1698 – 1760

## Founder of the Chassidic Movement

- Yisrael Ba'al Shem Tov founded the Chassidic movement in the early 18th century that changed the face of Jewish life forever.
- The Ba'al Shem Tov's fame spread far and wide, not only as a miracle worker, but as someone who lifted up the entire morale of the Jewish people by recognizing the divine spark in every individual.
- His teachings of the inner dimension of Torah, emphasis on joy and love of fellow and passionate prayer, revolutionized Judaism irrevocably.
- Yisrael was born to his parents Eliezer and Sarah, who were renowned for hospitality, in their old age. After being orphaned of both parents at age five, he grew up in the Jewish community of Tluste – Ukraine.
- He set his residence in the small town of Mezhibuz, but travelled extensively, raising Jewish spirits and inspiring the masses on his travels. His teachings of the inner dimension of Torah to the multitudes was a complete novelty and stirred up a lot of controversy in the Jewish world. Ultimately, nowadays, both the teachings of the Ba'al Shem Tov and his path have been universally accepted by all segments of the Jewish community.
- The Ba'al Shem Tov passed away on the first day of Shavuot and was buried in Mezhibuz. His resting place is a site of pilgrimage to this very day.

## Fascinating Facts

- Any miraculous tale is often referred to as a “Ba'al Shem Tov like story”
- In a vision on Rosh Hashanah 1746 he ascended to heaven and asked Mashiach “When will you come?” Mashiach responded “when your wellsprings will spread forth..”
- The Ba'al Shem tov emphasized the concept of “Hashgachah Pratit” that G-d is directly involved in all the happenings of the world down to the finest detail.
- The original handwritten Siddur of the Ba'al Shem Tov is housed in the Chabad library in New York.

The Ba'al Shem Tov attempted many times to travel to the Holy land, including getting as far as Constantinople (Istanbul). Alas it never came to be, but his successors students led the first Chassidic Aliyah in 1777.

# RABBI DOVBER "THE MAGGID OF MEZRITCH"

? – 1772

## Second Generation Chassidic Movement

- A year after the passing of the Ba'al Shem Tov Rabbi Dovber was formally appointed as his successor and the center of the Chassidic movement moved to Mezritsch. In his lifetime the Chassidic movement grew in leaps and bounds spreading across the entire Eastern Europe.
- Little is known about the formative years of Dovber. His parents, Avraham and Chava traced back their ancestry to King David. Originally known as a brilliant Talmudic scholar and student of the famed "Pnei Yehoshua", he lived a life of great poverty and self-mortification.
- He met the Ba'al Shem Tov in 1753 less than eight years before his passing. The Ba'al Shem Tov drew him in to his inner circle and studied with him the inner dimension of Torah.
- He eventually took up a position as Maggid (preacher) in Mezritsch.
- He had a group of sixty elite students known as the "Chevrayah Kadisha" Holy Society who were instrumental in the development and spreading of Chassidic teachings.
- Rabbi Dovber passed away on the 19th of Kislev and is buried in the town of Anipoli, Ukraine.

## Fascinating Facts

- Unlike the Ba'al Shem Tov, who travelled extensively, the Maggid remained in Mezritsch and sent his students to different regions to spread Chassidic teachings.
- In the Maggid's time there developed an opposition to the Chassidic movement which culminated in a ban on the Chassidim in 1772. The Maggid promised his students that despite the persecutions "The hand of the Chassidim will be victorious".
- The Maggid instructed his youngest student, Rabbi Shneur Zalman, to write a "Shluchan Aruch" Code of Jewish Law with its reasoning.

## ISRAEL CONNECTION

The First Chassidic Aliyah took place in 1777 led by the famed students of the Maggid – Rabbis Mendel of Horodok and Avraham of Kalisk. In all, over 300 Chassidim settled in the Holy Land – mainly in Tzfat and Tiberius.



## CHANUKAH

Chanukah is the festival of lights, celebrated with a nightly menorah lighting & special prayers.

Chanukah is an eight day holiday that begins Kislev 25 (eve of Dec 14) – Tevet 2 (Dec 22).

The Hebrew word Chanukah means “dedication,” and is thus named because it celebrates the rededication of the Holy Temple. The Assyrian-Greeks, who tried to Hellenize the Jews into Greek culture, captured the Holy Temple, placing idols inside. When the Maccabee’s miraculously defeated the mighty army and drove them from Israel, they rededicated the Temple. They found only one small flask of oil enough to light the Menorah for one night and G-d made a miracle that it lit for eight days, until new holy pure olive oil can be produced.

## HOW IS IT OBSERVED

- There are 8 candles and one Shamash (attendant) used to kindle the other candles.
- We start with one candle and add an additional candle every night.
- The candles shall be lit as it gets dark and burn for a minimum of 30 minutes.
- Friday make sure to light the Menorah before Shabbat and it should burn for at least 50 minutes.
- A menorah is lit in every household. In the Ashkenaz custom every male lights their own Menorah.
- The lights of the Menorah are to be publicized and therefore put at the entrance door or by the window.
- It is also important to light Menorahs in Shuls and public places.
- The tradition is to eat fried foods, namely Latkes or Sufganiyot (donuts).

## Chanukah Directives from the Rebbe

- The Rebbe initiated and strongly encouraged the public lighting of large Menorahs in prominent places around the world. This is done in order to publicize the miracle of Chanukah and bring Jewish pride and identity into the public sphere. This campaign transformed Chanukah observance globally and continues today with thousands of public menorahs worldwide.
- The Rebbe often emphasized the progressive nature of the mitzvah: each night we add a candle, symbolizing how in life and spirituality we must continually grow—never be satisfied with yesterday’s light.
- Chanukah comes from the word “Chinuch”, meaning education. The Rebbe urged investing in Jewish education, particularly for children, during this time—and to use the holiday as a teaching moment about Jewish identity, pride, and values.
- The Rebbe spoke about how Chanukah occurs during the darkest time of year (in the Northern Hemisphere) and how the menorah teaches that a little light dispels much darkness. This is a core Chabad message: illuminate your surroundings, even if the world seems dark.

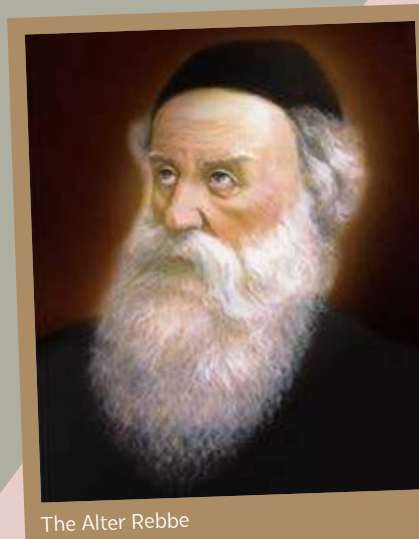

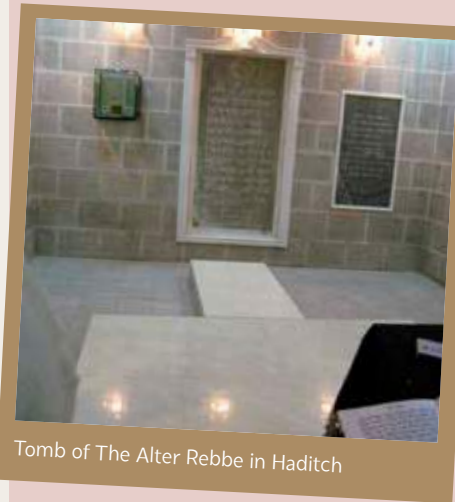
# RABBI SHNEUR ZALMAN OF LIADI "THE ALTER REBBE" 1745 – 1812

## Third Generation Chassidic Movement – First Rebbe of Chabad

- Rabbi Shneur Zalman, the youngest student of the Maggid of Mezritch, developed the ideas of Chassidism in a comprehensive manner developing the school of **Chabad** – an acronym for **Chochmah** - Wisdom, **Binah** – Understanding, and **Da'at** – Knowledge. It is the most recognizable Chassidic movement in the world today.
- He was born in 1745 to his parents Baruch and Rivka following a blessing from the Ba'al Shem Tov. He was a child prodigy and by age twelve was accepted as an equal by the great scholars of Vitebsk.
- As a young man Shneur Zalman traveled to the Maggid of Mezritch seeking to extend his horizons in service of G-d. Seeing his potential, the Maggid instructed his son Avraham (nicknamed "the Angel") to have a personal study session with the new student.
- Although he was the youngest student of the Maggid, he was the one who led the Chassidic movement in White Russia and Lithuania following the Maggid's passing.
- His teachings were published in his magnum opus – the **Tanya** in 1796. It is considered the Bible of Chassidic thought and studied by hundreds of thousands till this day.
- In 1798 he was arrested on trumped up charges of supporting the enemy of Russia, the Ottoman Turks. In reality the Alter Rebbe was sending money to support the poor of Israel. His release on the 19th of Kislev was seen by his followers as a vindication of his teachings and is celebrated as the "Rosh Hashana" of the Chassidic calendar.
- With Napoleon's invasion of Russia in 1812 and his support of the czar, he was forced to flee ahead of the advancing French army. He passed away on the 24th of Tevet in the small village of Pienna and was buried in Haditch.

## Fascinating Facts

- The Alter Rebbe mastered geometry and astronomy at nine, and composed a fifteen-year Hebrew calendar at only twelve years old.
- His imprisonment was an earthly manifestation of a heavenly prosecution against his spreading of Chassidic teachings. After his vindication he taught in a greater and lengthier manner.
- The **Chabad** path of divine service differed from his colleges in that while they saw attachment to a Tzaddik as the primary focus, the Alter Rebbe felt that closeness to G-d should come as a result of one's own efforts and toil.

## ISRAEL CONNECTION

The Alter Rebbe founded the charity **Collel Chabad** in 1788 to support the poor of Israel. It is the oldest and largest Charity in Israel today feeding over 3400 every day as well as providing many basic services for those in poverty.

# RABBI DOVBER SCHNEURI THE MITTELER REBBE

1773 – 1827

## Fourth Generation Chassidic Movement Second Rebbe of Chabad - Lubavitch

- The short tenure of Rabbi Dovber as Rebbe built upon and solidified the philosophy of his father and established the town of Lubavitch as the center of Chabad Chassidut for over a century.
- He was born in Liozna to his parents Rabbi Shneur Zalman and Sterna. He was named after his father's mentor – the Maggid of Mezritch. Still in his teens, he was appointed as mashpia (spiritual counselor) to the Chassidim who visited his father. After his father's passing, he took on the mantle of leadership and settled in the town of Lubavitch.
- As Rebbe, he devoted himself to helping the Jews of Russia personally lobbying the government to provide large tracts of land for farming colonies, as most businesses or professional jobs were closed to Jews.
- In all he set up thirty-nine settlements in the Kherson region. These communities lasted one hundred and twenty years till World War two.
- His methodology of Chassidic teaching was in great length and depth, building on the seminal teachings of his father. He authored over thirty works on all facets of Jewish mysticism and thought.
- He also diligently carried on his father's work in supporting the poor of Israel. However, like his father before him, he was accused of supporting the Sultan and was arrested and incarcerated in Vitebsk. He was eventually exonerated on the 10th of Kislev, a date which is celebrated by Chabad Chassidim to this day.
- He passed away on his 54th birthday in the town of Nyezhin and is buried there.

## Fascinating Facts

- Rabbi Dovber had a great appreciation for Chassidic music. At his request, a choir called the *Kapeliéh*, was formed by Chassidim. Their songs are sung to this day including the Chabad melody for Birkat Kohanim.
- His devotion to Chassidic teachings was extraordinary and Chassidim would say that should one cut the Mitteler Rebbe, blood would not flow but rather Chassidut.
- He passed away immediately after publicly reciting a Chassidic Discourse. His last words were "With you is the source of life."

## ISRAEL CONNECTION

He established the Jewish Community in Chevron - Israel in the early 1820s which lasted until the expulsion of the Jews of Chevron by the British in 1929. His daughter, Menucha Rachel Slonim, moved to Chevron and is buried there. She was known as the "mother of Chevron" and many came to receive her blessings.



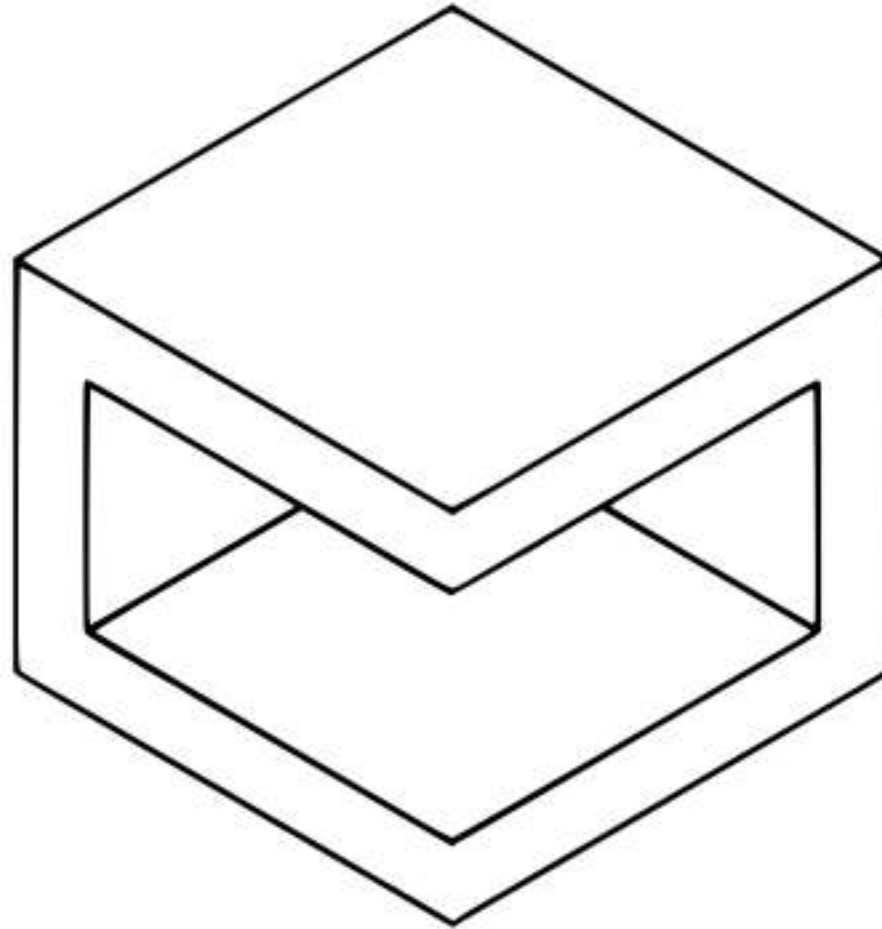



# RABBI MENACHEM MENDEL SCHNEERSON THE TZEMACH TZEDEK

1789 – 1866

## Fifth Generation Chassidic Movement Third Rebbe of Chabad - Lubavitch

- Rabbi Menachem Mendel's personal magnetism drew tens of thousands of Chassidim from all parts of Europe and Russia, and his thirty-eight years as leader of the movement were a colorful and flourishing period for Chabad.
- He was born on the eve of Rosh Hashanah in 1789. His mother Devorah Leah, a daughter of the Alter Rebbe passed away just after his third birthday. From that time on he was personally raised by his illustrious grandfather.
- By the time he was twelve he had written many treatises on matters of Halachic importance and had begun recording the Talmudic and Chassidic teachings of his grandfather, supplementing them with his own comments and explanations.
- After his uncle's & father-in-law, the second Rebbe's passing in 1827, he reluctantly accepted the leadership. He battled the infamous "Cantonist" decree with great success, saving many Jewish boys from the clutches of the czar's army and forced assimilation.
- He also famously stood up to government efforts to secularize Jewish education culminating in the Petersburg conference of 1843. He successfully brought together all elements of the Jewish community to combat the "maskilim" enlightenment movement.
- Following in the footsteps of his predecessor, establishing many more Jewish colonies including the town of Schedrin. This led to an expansion of the "Pale of the Settlement".
- He was a prolific writer authoring over 50 books in both Halacha and Chassidic thought.
- Rabbi Menachem Mendel passed away on the 13th of Nissan 1866 and is buried in Lubavitch.

## Fascinating Facts

- Rabbi Menachem Mendel had seven sons. Some of them started their own dynasties in other cities. His youngest son Shmuel succeeded him in Lubavitch.
- He was appointed a "Hereditary Honorary Citizen" by the Russian government because of his tireless efforts on behalf of the Jewish community.
- He once remarked that he spent over 32,000 hours compiling and editing the discourses of his grandfather. These works serve as basis of Chabad Chassidic philosophy.

## ISRAEL CONNECTION

His Chassidim founded a Shul in the Old City, built with assistance by the esteemed Sasson family of Bombay, India. After his passing it was named after him "the Tzemach Tzedek Shul". It was the only surviving Shul in the Old City and following the six-day war it was reopened and is a center of Jewish life in the old city on Chabad Street.

## Pesach Holiday

### HISTORY

3338 years ago (1313 BCE) the Jews left Egypt after 210 years of slavery. Jacob arrived in Egypt with a small family of seventy souls and at the exodus they numbered close to three million people.

### LAWS & CUSTOMS

We are forbidden to possess or own any Chametz (leaven) from April 1 – 9.

Chametz is anything that contains one of the five types of grain. Wheat, barley, oats, spelt, rye and their derivatives. The prevailing custom is to sell all ones non perishable Chametz through the agency of a Rabbi to a non-Jew for the duration of Pesach.

On the evening preceding Pesach we do a traditional search for Chametz by the light of a candle. Our custom is to put out ten (well wrapped) pieces of bread to ensure that we check the entire house. The following morning we burn the Chametz and declare that any Chametz of which we are unaware is ownerless like the dust of the earth.

The first two nights of Pesach are celebrated with the Seder (lit. order). At the Seder we drink four cups of Wine to commemorate the four expressions of redemption that G-d told Moses.

It is a Mitzvah for everyone to eat Matzah. This reminds us of the Matzah which the Jews ate as they left Egypt. Because they left hurriedly their dough did not have time to rise and they ended up with Matzah. It is also a Mitzvah to eat Maror (bitter herbs) to remind us of the bitter slavery which they experienced.

The fundamental part of the Seder is to discuss the story of the exodus with one's children.

This should be done in a manner that the participants truly feel what it would have been like to be liberated from bondage.

The Holiday of Pesach lasts eight days. The last days commemorate the miraculous crossing of the Red Sea whilst being pursued by Pharaoh's army. The Holiday concludes with Mashiach's meal, where we look forward to the final redemption through Mashiach.

### Did you know?

- Although Tishrei is the start of the civil year, Nissan is considered the first month in the Torah — because it's the month of freedom and redemption.
- The name "Nissan" likely comes from the Babylonian calendar, and may be related to the Hebrew word "nissim" meaning "miracles" — fitting, given the miraculous Exodus.
- Nissan is known in Jewish tradition as the month when redemption occurs. The Rabbis teach that just as the Exodus happened in Nissan, the future redemption will also happen in this month.
- The daily prayer of supplication (Tachanun) is not recited at all during Nissan, as it's considered a joyous month.

### Sell Your Chametz before March 31

It is prohibited to possess any chametz on Passover. This includes all unleavened products and items containing even small amounts of Chametz. Therefore any chametz left undisposed must be sold to a non-Jew for the duration of the holiday, as not using it is not enough. Actually, any chametz remaining in the possession of a Jew during Pesach may not be used, eaten, bought or sold even after Passover.

It is sold through a Rabbi, and then should be stored away in an area that is locked or taped shut as the space is leased to the non-Jew at the time of the chametz sale.

# RABBI SHMUEL SCHNEERSON THE REBBE MAHARASH

1834 – 1882

## Sixth generation Chassidic Movement Fourth Rebbe of Chabad - Lubavitch

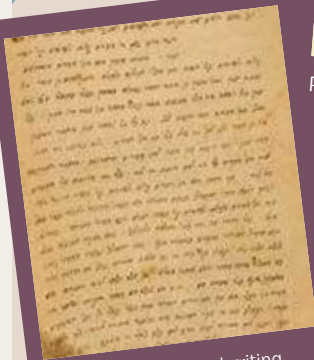
- Rabbi Shmuel of Lubavitch was the fourth link in the chain of Chabad leadership. In his short tenure as Rebbe, he strengthened Chassidus, combatted anti-Semitism, and prepared the ground for Chabad's global reach.
- Born in 1834, the youngest of seven sons to his illustrious father, the Tzemach Tzedek, He was thrust in to communal work from a young age. As distant travel became more available, he traveled extensively both in Russia and in Europe to meet and influence Jewish leaders and lobby governments and business leaders on behalf of Russian Jewry.
- In a time when antisemitism in Russia was on the rise, he stood up to officials, challenging them to protect the Jews and holding them to account. His fluency in many languages including Latin, French, and Russian assisted him in these selfless ventures.
- His teachings introduced the genre of "hemshech" a series of continuing discourses of Chassidic thought, and his published works are over twenty volumes.
- Although he suffered from ill health most of his life, this did not deter his efforts to lead the Chabad movement to new heights. Rabbi Shmuel passed away at the young age of 48 on the 13th day of Tishrei 1882 and is buried next to his father in Lubavitch.

## Fascinating Facts

- Rabbi Shmuel is perhaps most known for his saying (known in Yiddish as "*lechatchilah ariber*"): "The world says: If you can't go under [an obstacle], leap over; I say: In the first place, leap over!"
- Because of his ailments he engaged in Safrut (skill of a scribe) and carpentry. A table he crafted is in the Rebbe's room in 770.
- Prior to his leadership, the Rebbe authored a biography of Rabbi Shmuel published in 1946.

## ISRAEL CONNECTION

The third president of Israel, Zalman Shazar, had a grandfather who was a follower of the Rebbe Maharash. When he visited the Rebbe the first time in 1966, the Rebbe presented him with a discourse of the Rebbe Maharash which he personally autographed.

# THE REBBE'S YARTZEIT 3 TAMMUZ 5754 (1994)

## The Ten Mitzvah Campaigns

- Prior to the six-day war the Rebbe launched the Tefillin campaign, encouraging tens of thousands of Jews, particularly members of the IDF to lay Tefillin. This was the first of Ten Mitzvah Campaigns he initiated to raise Jewish awareness and identity.
- The first of five Mitzvah campaigns in 1974, the Rebbe launched the Torah Campaign encouraging every Jew to have a set time for Torah study.
- With terrorism on the rise the Rebbe declared a worldwide Mezuzah campaign for added protection.
- This was followed by the Tzedakah campaign. The Rebbe encouraged everyone that a charity box should be placed both at home and at work.
- The Rebbe pushed that every home be filled with Holy Jewish Books. Even a child must have the fundamental Jewish Books in his or her bedroom.
- The Hebrew acronym for Shabbat Candles is "neshek" also meaning weapons. The Rebbe spoke that every Jewish woman and girl (starting from three) should light Shabbat Candles to combat spiritual darkness.
- In 1975 the Rebbe launched the Kosher campaign citing the profound spiritual impact that Kosher food has on the entire household.
- Family Purity – the use of Mikvah by Jewish women is the foundation of Jewish married life, and has a powerful effect on the marriage and soul of the child.
- Love your fellow as yourself – the Rebbe emphasized the Chabad approach of non-judgementalism and love of one's fellow regardless of background or appearance.
- In 1976 the Rebbe declared the year of Jewish education, that every Jewish child deserves an authentic Torah education.

# RABBI SHOLOM DOVBER REBBE RASHAB

1860 – 1920

## Seventh Generation Chassidic Movement Fifth Rebbe of Chabad - Lubavitch

- Rabbi Sholom DovBer Schneerson's era of leadership spanned a time of great political upheaval in Russia and beyond. He devoted himself to the future of the Jewish nation by involving himself in education on all levels. He founded the flagship Chabad yeshiva Tomchei Temimim, the first to incorporate Chasidic thought into its syllabus. He also focused on strengthening communities in remote areas, such as the remote Sephardic communities in Uzbekistan and Georgia, by personally sending his students to guide them.
- Born in Lubavitch, he was marked for leadership at a young age by his grandfather, the Tzemach Tzedek. After his father's passing his older brother refused the leadership citing his younger brother's holiness and leadership abilities. He only formally accepted to become Rebbe eleven years after his father passed away.
- Famed for his phenomenal mind and analytical treatment of Chabad philosophy, Rabbi Sholom DovBer wrote and delivered some two thousand Chassidic discourses over the thirty-eight years of his leadership. He is known as the "Maimonides of Chabad Chassidism," for his ability to organize topics in Chassidic thought.
- In 1897 he founded the famed Yeshiva in Lubavitch. This school produced an army of learned, inspired and devoted disciples, who in the decades to come would be at the forefront of the effort to keep the flames of Judaism alive under Soviet rule and oppression.
- He also took a great care to assist Jews who were oppressed by the government. He established factories to give Jews employment and arranged for Matzot to be sent to the front for Jewish soldiers in the Russo-Japanese war in 1904.
- Due to the turmoil caused by the First World War, in the autumn of 1915 Rabbi Sholom DovBer moved from the town of Lubavitch to the city of Rostov on the Don River.
- In the aftermath of the Bolshevik revolution, he turned his efforts to fighting against the Soviet Union's efforts to squelch Yiddishkeit.
- He passed away at the age of 59 on the Nissan 2 and is buried in Rostov.

## Fascinating Facts

- He had a close relationship with many of the leading Rabbis of his time including the "Chafetz Chaim", Rabbi Chaim of Brisk, and Rabbi Chaim Ozer Gorodetsky of Vilna.
- His discourses are renowned as the deepest and most comprehensive in Chabad Chassidic thought. His longest series of discourses spanned 3 years and 147 discourses!
- His last words to his son and successor were "I am going to heaven, but I leave you my writings"

## ISRAEL CONNECTION

In 1911 He established a Yeshiva in Chevron called Torat Emet and invested heavily in the community there. Forced to move to Jerusalem in 1929 it is one of the longest continuous Yeshiva's in the Holy Land.

# RABBI YOSEF YITZCHAK SCHNEERSON PREVIOUS REBBE

1880 – 1950

## Eighth Generation Chassidic Movement Sixth Rebbe of Chabad - Lubavitch

- Rabbi Yosef Yitzchak Schneerson was leader of tremendous strength, courage and passion, who stood at the forefront of the battle for Judaism in the Soviet Union and the fight to establish Judaism in the New World.
- Born in the town of Lubavitch, in his youth he was his father's right-hand man and later became the director of the Lubavitch Yeshivah. He travelled extensively throughout Europe participating in Rabbinical gatherings and lobbying on behalf of Russian Jewry.
- After the Bolshevik revolution and his fathers passing, he established an underground network of hundreds of Jewish Schools, Yeshivah's and Mikvas throughout the Soviet Union.
- In 1927 he was arrested by the authorities and imprisoned in Leningrad. Originally sentenced to death, his sentence was eventually commuted to exile and release.
- He was forced to relocate to Riga, Latvia, and later to Poland, but his courageous efforts on behalf of the Jews of Russia never ceased. Many of his devoted Chassidim were either executed or died in the Gulag in the struggle for Russian Jewry.
- IN 1929 – 30 he visited Israel followed by the United States, where he stayed for ten months galvanizing the Jewish community.
- After the breakout of World War two he was trapped in Warsaw. With a lot of diplomatic pressure, he was eventually spirited out via Latvia and Sweden eventually arriving in New York in the winter of 1940.
- When he arrived, he declared "America is no different" and set out immediately to build American Jewry.
- In the last ten year of his life, though hindered by multiple sclerosis, he developed numerous schools for both boys and girls laying the ground for the tremendous growth of the Chabad movement.
- He passed away in 1950 and is buried the Montefiore cemetery in N.Y.

- In 1929 the previous Rebbe met with U.S. President Herbert Hoover at the White House.
- When threatened with a gun in interrogation, he responded "your toy can frighten someone who has many Gods and one world, but I have one G-d and two worlds, your toy doesn't frighten me".
- The previous Rebbe established Chabad in Montreal in 1941 with nine of his Yeshivah students who fled Poland by way of Japan and Shanghai.

## ISRAEL CONNECTION

Rabbi Yosef Yitzchak is the only Chabad Rebbe to visit Israel. In 1929 he spent ten days there visiting the entire country and meeting with countless Rabbis and public figures. He was the first Jew allowed in to Cave of Machpeleh for many years.

# RABBI MENACHEM MENDEL SCHNEERSON - THE REBBE

1902 – 1994

## Ninth Generation Chassidic Movement Seventh Rebbe of Chabad - Lubavitch

The Lubavitcher Rebbe, Rabbi Menachem Mendel Schneerson, of saintly memory was born in 1902, on the 11th day of Nissan, in Nikolayev, Russia.

By the age of Bar Mitzvah he was considered a Torah prodigy.

In 1928 the Rebbe married the daughter of the sixth Lubavitcher Rebbe. Rebbetzin Chaya Mushka, in Warsaw. After their marriage the young couple lived in Berlin where the Rebbe studied. After the rise of the Nazis in 1933 they moved to France where the Rebbe studied at the Sorbonne. All the while he was heavily involved in carrying out communal work on behalf of his father-in-law, the previous Rebbe.

After fleeing to Vichy, France to escape the Germans they eventually took one of the last boats to cross the Atlantic from Portugal. On June 23, 1941 the Rebbe and the Rebbetzin miraculously arrived in the United States.

The Rebbe was immediately appointed by his father-in-law to head Chabad's outreach organizations and publishing House.

After the passing of his father-in-law, in 1950, Rabbi Menachem M. Schneerson ascended to the leadership of the Chabad movement.

- In 1951 he sent his first Shliach – personal emissary to Casablanca, Morocco. Over the next four decades the Rebbe sent thousands of Shluchim to all corners of the globe to reawaken Jews to their heritage.
- Following the passing of his mother in 1964 the Rebbe began giving public talks on the teaching of Rashi. His unique and brilliant exposition of the depth of Rashi's teachings opened a new vista in Jewish scholarship.
- In 1981 the Rebbe declared that every Jewish child should purchase their own letter in the Torah. To date, eight have been completed and over two million Jewish children have bought letters!
- In 1984 the Rebbe announced a campaign to study the entire code of Law of the Rambam (Maimonides). The most comprehensive work encompassing every Mitzvah. It has since been completed over 40 times!
- Throughout the eighties the Rebbe encouraged that it is the role of the Jewish people to reach out to non-Jews and educate them about the Seven Universal laws of Noah that are incumbent of all of society.
- The Rebbe spoke constantly and urgently about the coming of Moshiach saying that "we are last generation of exile and the first of redemption" and that adding in acts of goodness and kindness will hasten his immediate arrival.









